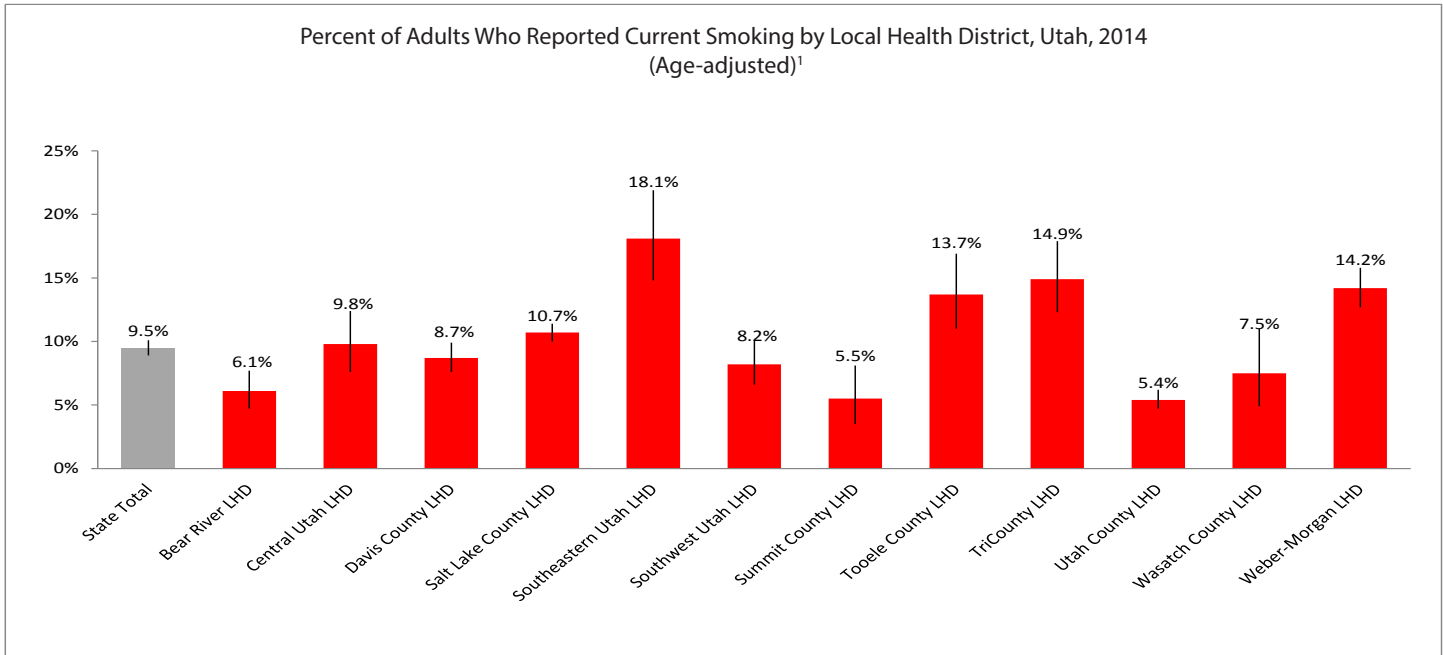


Smoking by Health District and Sex

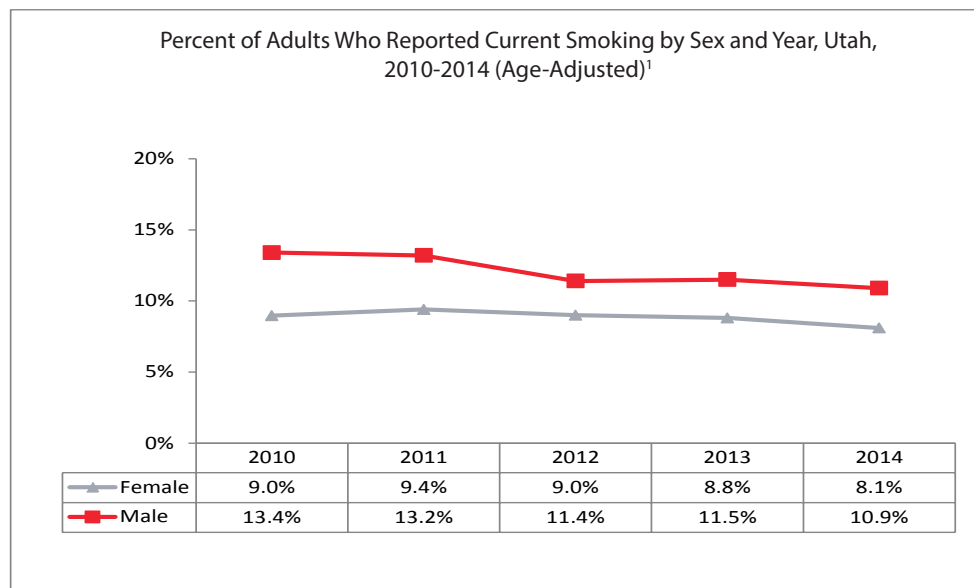
Adult Smoking by Local Health District

Among local health districts, adults from Southeastern Utah (18.1%), TriCounty (14.9%), Weber-Morgan (14.2%), and Tooele County (13.7%) reported the highest levels of cigarette smoking. These local health districts, along with Salt Lake County Local Health District, have smoking rates that are significantly higher than the state rate of 9.5%. Adults from Wasatch County (7.5%), Bear River (6.1%), Summit County (5.5%) and Utah County (5.4%) health districts reported smoking rates that were significantly lower than the state rate.¹ A map of smoking rates by local health district can be found online at: <http://arcg.is/1RwHLM9>.



Adult Smoking by Sex

From 2010 to 2014, Utah women (ages 18+) reported significantly lower smoking rates than Utah men. In 2014, 8.1% of women and 10.9% of men reported current smoking. Men reported significantly lower smoking rates in 2014 compared to 2010. The smoking rate for women, while lower, did not decrease significantly from 2010 to 2014.
